2023 GGG Simulator Hanan Girgis, Ph.D.

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I- Introduction:

The Objective of the GGG simulator is to provide a simulation of the Global Gender Gap index in, as it calculates the overall index and Egypt's ranking based on any changes that occur to the indicators calculated from it.

The Simulator help decision makers to prioritize the interventions to be made to maximize the improvement in Egypt's rank in the GGG.

II- GGG for Egypt:

Egypt score decreased from 0.635 in 2022 to 0.626 in 2023 causing a deterioration in the rank from 129 in 2022 to 134 in 2023.

The decrease in the score is partially attributed to the missing values of the enrollment rate in primary education. If the enrollment rates used in 2022 index were used in 2023 index, Egypt score would be 0.633 and the rank would be 132.
